

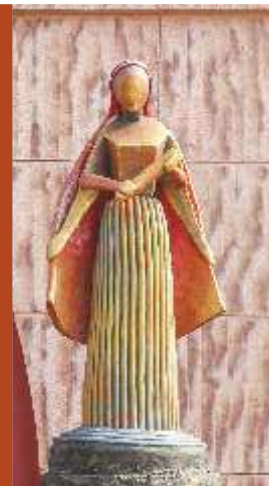

DESCRIPTION OF THE EMBLEM

A Woman with a book in one hand and a pen in the other is the very incarnation of self-confidence. This is the Emblem of Karnataka State Women's University. The Lamps symbolize Knowledge: The Hands denote Akkamahadevi and Chand bibi, the two women of this region who crusaded for the upliftment of women. The Seven bangles in the hand represent the seven colors emerging unified as a ray of light: The bangles in the left hand represent the Panchabhutas. The Rainbow behind the Woman holding a pen aloft represents the rainbow of promises; the figure of the Arch in the background stands for the architectural heritage of Vijayapur. The Gol Gumbaz to its right and the Anubhava Mantap to its left, herald the Religious Harmony and History of Bijapur. The peepul tree and the coconut tree, which form a halo around the arch, symbolize Enlightenment and Prosperity.

The Structure supporting all these signifies the mythological Adishesha who believed to be upholding the earth. The dancing lines are metaphors of femininity, the picture reminds us of the Buddha in deep meditation and the MOTTO is "Education for Woman is Education for all"



Vice Chancellor's Desk

I have assumed charge of this university, as fourth Vice Chancellor on 20th June 2016 three and half months after the laying down of office by the then regular Vice Chancellor. Introduction of the University



Karnataka State Akkamahadevi Women's University, came into existence as per the Karnataka State Universities Act No. 33 of 2003 (Amended) with the Assent of the Governor of Karnataka on 20th day of August 2003. Formerly known as Karnataka State Women's University has been renamed as Karnataka State Akkamahadevi Women's University on 11th June 2017. It is the only Women's University in Karnataka dedicated exclusively for women's education. It is recognized under 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act and accredited by NAAC with "B" grade. The university is also a recipient of Four Stars in KSURF rankings. The University jurisdiction extended over the state of Karnataka along with two extension centers – one at Mandya with five PG Courses and another PG centre at Sindhanoor running couple of PG programmes and Udatadi- PG and Research center. The state government has sanctioned 4 acre land at Addiganahalli village in Hesarghatta Hobali, Bengaluru. With this land, it is proposed to start the regional and competitive exams training centre affiliated to Karnataka State Akkamahadevi Women University Vijaypur. Total 156 women's colleges spread over the entire state are affiliated to this University.



The Karnataka State Akkamahadevi Women's University strives continuously for furthering the advancement of learning and prosecution of higher education, research and skill training for women. The University is marching ahead towards overall development by opening the gateway of opportunities in higher education and skill development among women. Many innovative projects are also being designed and implemented to empower women. University curriculum is more emphasized to meet the employer's expectations. Students can choose any subject in third and fourth semesters as Open Elective Course. Feminine Jurisprudence and Women's Health will be taught to all the students in the first two semesters.

The University provides a theoretical understanding of the gender unequal society; creates an awareness in legal rights; helps in identifying the potentialities & strengthens confidence; prepares them to lead a self sufficient & meaningful life by sharing responsibilities & claiming rights. A major objective of the University has been to promote a dialogue between academics and activists, social work and policy making. By facilitating research and extension work, the aim is to enhance the visibility of women and gender issues within the academic community of the University and indeed in wider society. The University has also worked towards creating a platform for sensitizing government agencies, members of the academy and activists. The activities carried out at the University are multi-faceted. Besides being involved in various fields of research on women, seminars and workshops are conducted regularly on different topics, sometimes in collaboration with other organizations. Research publications are an important aspect of the University. The University has adopted two villages for over all development and also conducted lots of extension programmes at grassroots level. The University has highly qualified and Multifaceted and experienced faculty and academic staff. The faculty is committed to empower students with clear theoretical perspective and practical knowledge; give awareness about the legal rights and responsibilities; to identify potentialities and build confidence and self respect; equip them with skills and knowledge to work in different sectors and to be economically self sufficient.

The congenial atmosphere provided by the university encourages women from rural and socio-economically weak background to pursue higher education. Nearly 28% of students belong to SC and ST category and about another 50% belong to minorities and other backward communities. Even the remaining 22% of students come from rural and economically poor background. Thus, the university is sincerely striving to empower rural women and contribute towards poverty alleviation.

Infrastructure and Facilities

The University has its own campus 'Jnanashakti' spread over 286 acres situated at a distance of 10 KM from the city. Its Extension Centre at Mandya is operational from academic year 2014-15 and from academic year 2016-17, a post graduate centre at Sindhanur has been started. This apart the university is in the process of establishing a Skill Development Centre at Udatadi in Shimoga district for which about 10 acres of land has been donated by the Akkamahadevi Trust Udatadi to the University. Three hostels with spacious dining hall, prayer hall and modern recreation centre is constructed in Jnana Shakti campus with requisite infrastructure and round the clock security. These accommodate 300 students. Total 700 hundred students are staying in the campus and we converted some of the buildings as temporary hostels. Canteen facility is available in the Jnanashakti campuses providing tea, coffee, snacks including wholesome food at affordable rates. The University has its own transport facility and buses ply between hostels and Jnanashakti campus. The library is equipped with rich collection of books, periodicals, including e-resources. The library data collection and services have been automated using library software package developed by LIBSYS. The library subscribes e-journals and provides Internet facilities. Departments are equipped with full-fledged Computer Laboratories with Internet facility. A Central Computer Facility with Internet connectivity is available for students in the campus. The language laboratory is well established with 20 computers and required furniture. Highly useful soft-wares are installed. To facilitate the students in Media Technology, a high tech state of the art Multi Media Centre and Hi-Tech TV Studio is established in the Department of Journalism and Mass Communication, Jnanashakti Campus. A well equipped health fitness centre is established in the campus and is open for use by all students. The centre is equipped with station multi gym, manual tread mill, motorized heavy duty tread mill, magnetic bike, magnetic cycle, competition olympian barbell set, chrome dumbbells, etc. A health

centre well equipped with all basic requirements from first aid to emergency treatment is established. It provides free medical treatment to the students and staff members.

Unique and Special Features

The University has established a Women's Technology Park which is one of its kind in the state providing a variety of skill training programmes to women especially from backward areas. The park includes the following programmes/centres which have been running in a humble way which require a substantial financial support from International Development Agency to strengthen them.

KSAWUV: Four Year Report (2016-2020)

Introduction

Immediately after assuming the charge as Vice Chancellor of this exclusively women's university I dreamt of developing this university as more women friendly campus over a period of five years. In this regard a two day workshop was organized from 13/10/2016 to 14/10/2016 by inviting academicians, industrialists, women activists and administrators from all parts of the country. Past Vice Chancellors of women's universities and experts on women's education were also invited. As a result of this workshop a perspective plan "Vision 2020" was developed with due emphasis on first six months, first one year, first two years like that. Programmes were also designed in the same way. I am happy that I could implement all the programmes with the help of teaching, non-teaching staff and Government's support according to the plan we had strategized with few exceptions due to scarcity of financial resources, technical hiccups, and other unexpected problems.

In the meanwhile the Government of Karnataka decided to rename the university as "Karnataka State Akkamahadevi Women's University" ascribing tribute to the 12th century philosopher a legendary Vachanakarti Akkamahadevi who fought for the cause of women empowerment. It was my proud privilege to be part of this great moment. A biggest renaming function was organized in the Jnanashakti campus where in more than one lakh women took participation in the mega event. The then Chief Minister Honourable Shri. Siddaramaiah, the then Honourable Minister for Higher Education Shri Basavaraj Rayareddy, the then District in charge Minister Honourable Shri. M B Patil and a number of cabinet ministers, MPs, MLAs, MLCs and other representatives of people participated. His Holiness Shri Siddeshwar swamiji of Jnanayogashrama and more than fifty seers of different Peethas' also participated in this major event. The function was successfully organized by the university with due support from district administration and people of Vijayapura.

When I took charge there were 124 affiliated colleges offering UG courses and 9 colleges offering P G Courses. Within four years the number of affiliated colleges offering U G courses rose to 164 and offering P G courses rose to 13. It was my desire to start colleges in the rural areas as many young girls were deprived of higher education. I am happy that I could start 26 colleges in the rural areas. With the expansion of jurisdiction of the University to the entire state, women's colleges under the aegis of this University were established in the districts of Davanagere, Chitradurga, Tumakur, Bengaluru, Shivamogga. Many more educationists have shown interest to start women's colleges in other parts of the state.

Post-Graduate Centers'

Owing to the success of Extension Center at Mandya, there was a demand to establish a P G Center at Sindhanur. With the support of the then MLA Sindhanur constituency Shri. Hampanagowda Badarli and the then Syndicate Member Shri R C Patil and the Raichur District Administration, P G center was formally established at Sindhanur on

10/9/2016 with starting of 4 P G courses in the premises of Government First Grade College. Honourable Minister for Higher Education Shri Basavaraj Rayareddy inaugurated the P G Center and the then Honourable MLA Sindhanur Shri Hampanagouda Badarli participated. With constant efforts and from the support of local administration, Government of Karnataka has sanctioned 6 acres of land on Sindhanur – Kustagi road. With the funding from HKDB, construction work of ADM building is in progress at an estimated cost of Rs. 19 crore of which Rs. 11.5 crore has been released. One wing of the Class room's building was inaugurated on 12th March 2020. The building will be functional from the academic year 2020-21.

There was a proposal from Akkamahadevi Samiti Udutadi to hand-over 8 acres of land with few constructed buildings to the Women's University by contributing Rs. 20 lakhs as Chaitanya Nidhi to start an exclusively skill development center at Udutadi. Having followed all legalities the land got transferred to the university and the center was officially declared open by the then Minister for Higher Education, Government of Karnataka on 29/5/2017. The center was named as Akkamahadevi Center for Research, Skill Development and Extension. With few modifications in the existing buildings, to suit class room requirements, M Com course was started from the academic year 2019 -20. Skill development programmes have been started. I take this opportunity to thank Dr. Leeladevi R Prasad, Former Minister for Kannada and Culture, Government of Karnataka and President of Akkamahadevi Samiti, Udutadi for her magnanimity in transferring the land to the University to see to it that a center is established there at Udutadi.

It was felt that our students lack opportunities to get trained for competitive examinations like UPSC, KPSC and other such examinations in a metro set up. Hence discussions were held with different officials concerned to sanction a suitable land at Bengaluru to establish a coaching center for competitive examinations. Government of Karnataka has sanctioned 4 acres of land on 5/2/2018 at Addiganahalli near Bengaluru to start the academy. The land is fenced and construction work will soon start. I would like to thank Govt of Karnataka for sanctioning the land and also would like to thank Shri Siddaramaiah the then chief minister of Karnataka and Shri. V Shankar the then Deputy Commissioner Bengaluru district without whose support this would not have taken place.

Administration

- To strengthen the administration and to provide fast pace for file movement and implement the decisions taken by the Vice Chancellor's office, a senior Professor was appointed as Special Officer to Vice Chancellor. This was the first ever attempt in the history of the university.
- To bring women into administration senior teachers were appointed as Registrar (First ever), Finance Officer, Director Kaushalya Women's Technology Park (First ever) and Resident Engineer (First ever). An young lady teacher was appointed as Director of Sports. This is the first time in the history of the University that three of the four statutory posts are occupied by women. Many key responsibilities were also given to lady teachers, thus bringing them to the main stream of administration.
- In the same line many young teachers were brought into administration as Deputy Registrars, Deputy Finance Officer, Assistant Directors and Assistant Coordinators.
- By streamlining the purchase procedure a store section was created and senior most office superintendent was given the responsibility to handle the store.
- A single window inward and outward section was created to streamline the inward-outward of letters process and it is computerized with 3 staff.
- After a series of discussion a 'Records Retention Policy' was framed and a records room was set up in the premises of the Vice Chancellors' office for easy tracking of files and letters. Orientation was given to the case workers how to maintain the file and close them according to the policy framed. So far more than 6206 files were identified and given labels and more than 1260 files were kept in the records' room.

Academic Programmes

I took initiation to start 4 P G courses at P G Center Sindhanur (M A – English, M Sc – Computer Science, M Com and M Sc – Mathematics) and 1 P G course at P G center Udutadi (M Com). Two Ph D programmes – Hindi and Food Processing & Nutrition were started from the academic year 2019-20. M Sc Statistics and P G Diploma in Yoga Studies were also started. I laid emphasis on strengthening the existing courses by submitting the statutes of the departments which were already running for approval, recruiting qualified guest faculty revision of syllabus and developing proper laboratories etc.

I took a dare decision to implement the uniform regulations for all U G courses in a new pattern of assessment (70:30 in place of existing 80:20). I am sure this will certainly pave way for the university to go for CBCS pattern in the near future. Utmost care was taken to maintain uniformity and standardization in prescribing the texts for U G courses. The texts for languages - Kannada, English and Hindi were completely revised and redesigned with much emphasis on 'women's perspective' by constituting special BOS consisting of experts from different universities in the state.

As part of CBCS pattern P G Departments were encouraged to start value added courses. Two departments – Department of Journalism & Mass Communication and Department of Library & Information Science have introduced value added certificate, diploma and advance Diploma courses.

Research

Utmost importance was given to promote research culture on the campus. P G teachers were given seed money to conduct research. 43 teachers' were sanctioned Rs. 44.35 lakhs to conduct research out of university grants and SCP/TSP and UGC grants. This has really encouraged the teachers to undertake research work. In addition to this teachers were suggested to write project proposals to various funding agencies. This initiation has motivated the teachers to write projects and as a result of which projects worth Rs. 1,57,92,900.00/- got sanctioned. The details are as follows.

Human Resources

I consider human sources as most valued capital assets. Hence I gave due importance to the wellbeing of the staff on the campus. I have taken the following initiations for the betterment of staff from all perspectives.

- 33 teaching staff (5 Professors, 10 Associate Professors and 18 Assistant Professors) were appointed maintaining transparency. The recruitment process was appreciated by media and many others. This is the second biggest recruitment process that took place in the university after its inception.
- For the first time in the university since its inception, 10 non-teaching staff under Section 371 (J) (Hyderabad-Karnataka) belonging to Group A (Assistant Registrar -1), Group B (Office Superintendent - 1), Group C (Nurse/ANM - 1, Lab Assistant - 1, Typist (Computer Operator -1) and Group D (Peon -2, Ayah -1, Fitter -1) were appointed in a transparent manner
- 17 teachers were promoted as Assistant Professors – Grade –I to Grade II and Grade – II to Grade – III
- 5 teachers were promoted as Associate Professors
- 3 Associate Professors were promoted under CAS as Professors
- Got sanction for the creation of posts for 4 departments – Chemistry, Mathematics, Physics and Computer Applications got approved
- Got approval for the recruitment of 10 Assistant Professor's for which recruitment process is initiated
- 2 superannuated teachers of the university were appointed as Visiting Professors among them 1 teacher later became Professor Emeritus. 2 more superannuated teachers from other institutions were also appointed as Visiting Professors.
- Solved the long pending issue of EPF/ESI of non-teaching staff who are working in the university since its inception. Now each staff member has her/his own number and the amount is directly credited to their account.
- Medical reimbursement facility was extended to all the permanent teaching and non-teaching staff. This was pending since beginning.
- Took initiation to conduct two capacity building workshops for non-teaching staff
- 9 teachers have visited foreign countries to present papers in seminars/conference while 4 teachers have visited foreign countries as part of their research/fellowship
- 6 teachers' have been superannuated during my tenure and I have taken personal interest to see to it that they superannuate without any hassles. The financial benefits to which they were eligible were extended to them on the day of superannuation. They are getting pension benefits from the very next month of their superannuation.

Student support services

Students constitute the very lively life of any institution. I consider them as ambassadors of our university. Hence they were my utmost priority. To provide them a feeling of satisfaction the following initiatives have been made

- SC/ST students can take admission without paying any fees for P G programs
- First time in the history of the university, Students association was started and they were actively involved in university's programmes
- "Ghanateya Baduku" a gender sensitization programme to inculcate awareness on various gender issues including legal rights and human rights was regularly organized every year in the main campus and also at Jnanasindhu (Sindhnanur) and Jnana Kaveri (Mandya) campuses. In all 54 programmes were conducted in which 2005 students, 55 research scholars and 285 teaching and non-teaching staff got benefit from these programmes.
- 6 workshops on media skills were organized to inculcate media skills among U G and P G students. 560 students from 12 state universities and 3 private universities in Karnataka exploited the benefit.
- 17 research scholars belonging to SC/ST category were funded to visit foreign countries to present their research papers
- All India study tours (including Nepal) for SC/ST students were organized three times. They visited places like Chaityabhoomi, Ambedkar's residence and Museum at Mumbai, Sanchi, Parivartan Sthal, Deeksha Bhoomi, Nepal, Lumbini, Kapilavastu, Buddha Gaya, Saranath, Ajantha, Ellora. In all 356 students were benefited.
- Due emphasis was given to supply quality food in the hostel. Hence regular food quality audits were conducted. For the first time non-vegetarian food section is introduced.
- To encourage the student participation in cultural and sports events, registration fee used to be taken by the host institution from the participants to organize Inter-collegiate Youth Festival/ Athletic meets is waived off. Because of this the participation of colleges and number of students participation significantly increased
- To enhance the entrepreneurship capability of students, training cum hands on demonstration on Value addition of Fish and Fisheries products

Karnatak State Akkamahadevi Women's University was considered for RUSA funding in the second phase. The proposal was approved during the 9th PAB Meeting held on 1.12.2015. An amount of Rs. 20.00 crore was sanctioned under Component 3: infrastructure grants to universities. The University has been taken up several developmental works under RUSA grant. New construction works, up gradation/renovation of buildings and creation of facilities or purchase of equipments was done using the RUSA funding.

RUSA has introduced a significant strategic shift in the approach towards developing the higher education system, by focusing on state level institutions. RUSA funding is a turning point for strengthening infrastructural facilities in our University. RUSA funding of Rs. 20.0 crores by Ministry of Human Resource Development, under the component- Infrastructural facilities has come as a boon to our University as a means for establishing attractive and modern infrastructure i.e. classrooms, research laboratories, training equipment, play grounds, aids etc. RUSA funding, being norm based funding, is a turning point for our University which facilitates to achieve higher enrolment rates and address access, equity and quality related concerns. Students and faculty of our University have been immensely benefitted with the funding received under RUSA.

The creation of new facilities has been done keeping in mind the growing need for introducing new curriculum under CBCS and our faculty and students have been immensely benefitted with the facilities being created. Under the Head 'New Construction' Electronics building has been constructed which has been shared by related Physics, Mathematics and Statistics department bringing in the related courses under one roof. The construction of Library building has immensely benefitted student's community in terms of adequate reading facility. The RUSA grant also facilitated procurement of new equipments for laboratories of various PG Science departments. Equipments like computers, networking devices and licensed softwares were also purchased for further development of the IT

infrastructure of the University. To provide the necessary impetus to the teaching learning process, several books, journals and e-resources were added to the library. The facility being established and its utilization by the stake holders have been appreciated by the Physical Verification committee of Karnataka State Higher Education Council during its visit on 22nd December, 2018.

The overall impact of the RUSA funding may be seen in the improved academic performance of our students and the successful utilization of resources by our teachers in disseminating the knowledge to students. The University is grateful for the financial assistance offered by RUSA and commends its vision of improving the overall quality of education by introducing transformative reforms in the higher education system.

CAMPUS DEVELOPMENT

- Emphasis was laid on making the campus a lush green one. It was a difficult task as the area is completely rocky. But with continuous efforts a number of gardens (in front administration block, near science block, near library building, in front of JMC building, social science building, education building and many more) with aesthetic lawns were created on the campus. This is made possible only by the tireless efforts of Dr R Sunandamma Registrar. I thank her for her keen interest and continuous effort.
- Around 5000 trees were planted on the campus to add to the beauty of campus
- As part of greenhouse plant nursery was developed
- The campus is now connected with good asphalted roads amounting to 5 KM within the campus.
- Helipad is developed on the campus
- An amazing innovative rock garden was created on the theme "Heritage of human culture" designed by Shri. Harshavardhan Solabakkanavar, Gotagodi, on the front side of the campus. This has attracted many people.
- Using one more theme 'Women achievers' a theme park was also created on the occasion of renaming the university. Statues of Akkamahadevi, Savitribai Phule, Mother Theresa, Chand Bibi, Rani Channamma, Hemareddy Mallamma, Amirbai Karnataki, Mary Curie, Kalpana Chawla, Saalumurada Timmakka, P T Usha are all found there. This spot is also a place of attraction.
- 5 RO units at a cost of Rs. 45 lakhs were set up to provide clean, healthy and safe water to the students and staff on the campus
- With the support from District administration and City Corporation 3 high mast lights were installed and thereby helping the campus to shine at night hours and 15 benches were erected which has helped students for sitting during leisure time.
- Two solar plants have been installed under Government of India's SECI-BOOT scheme, which have the capability to generate 170KWH electricity. It has been linked to on-grid connectivity. I am happy to place it on record that the university is saving more than Rs. 80000/- every month
- 63KVA transformer was replaced by 250KVA transformer to meet our power demand.
- As a measure of safety precautions 8 control panels were installed. This has helped to achieve load balance and also minimize expenditure on maintenance.

- All affiliated colleges, PG Departments, PG centers have actively participated in the Scholarship portal SSP – Student Scholarship Portal

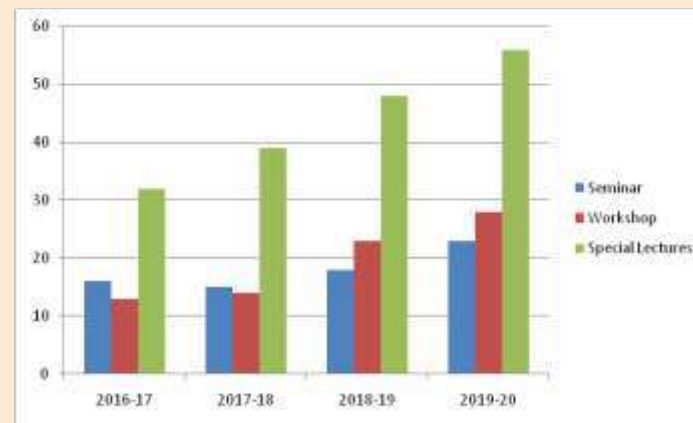
Quality Enhancement

I firmly believe that an institution will be recognized only if it nurtures quality. In the initial phase of tenure only I advocated for quality enhancement in teaching, learning, research and other activities of the university. Hence the following measures have been taken

- The UGC regulations were implemented as soon as they are notified to maintain the standards whether it is minimum qualification for direct recruitment or CAS of teachers or award of Ph D/M Phil or affiliation of colleges or detection of plagiarism or ethical code of conduct of research or maintaining campus discipline.
- The University was given the status 3 Stars (***) by K-SURF in 2017. Because of the efforts of everyone the university received 4 Stars (****) by K-SURF in 2019. The university has received 5 Stars (*****) consecutively two times under parameter "Inclusiveness and Social Impact".
- Green audit has been conducted
- AQAR's for the years 2016-17, 2017-18, 2018-19 have been uploaded to NAAC website as per their instructions
- Academic and Administrative Auditing has been done in 2019. The Committee had given its report highlighting the positive points to be straightened and areas to be improved.
- NAAC II cycle accreditation is due by 2021 February. Hence much in advance preparations have been going on. A senior teacher is appointed as Coordinator and I am hopeful that the university will get better ranking compared to previous accreditation.

Crisis Management

During my tenure I had to face with few crises. With the able support of staff, students, parents, Principals of affiliated colleges, District administration and other stakeholders I could be able to overcome these obstacles.

Water scarcity: During 2017 April scarcity of water was noticed. In spite of all efforts, the scarcity of water created havoc on the campus leaving the University to close its campus till alternative arrangements are made. On hearing the news the then District in charge Minister shri. M B Patil, the then Deputy Commissioner, Vijayapura district Shri. K B Shivakumar, Shri. Harsha Shetty Commissioner Vijayapura Corporation, Water Supply Board officials and Toravi Gram Panchayat, took measures on war foot basis. With the able support from them the water crisis was resolved within 24 hours and the campus was reopened the very next day. I must remember the then Registrar Shri K P Shrinath who personally supervised the digging of 2 bore wells on the campus. Later during April 2019 owing to summer water requirements, 4 more bore-wells were dug using university resources. I am happy to place it on records that the University has not faced any water scarcity problems then onwards.

Heavy rains: Heavy rains created havoc in the entire region during the beginning of academic year 2019-20. The affiliated colleges needed to be closed for many days. Many of our students (UG, PG and Research scholars) either got stuck in their villages or lost their documents like certificates, Marks cards or lost their class notes. Many of them have also lost their homes. The Registrar (Evaluation) was appointed as Nodal Officer to monitor the situation. Required help was extended to the needy one with the support of NSS units of colleges and University. The university has decided to distribute marks cards and other certificates free of cost to the students if they have lost them in floods.

COVID-19: During the fag end of my period (March onwards) as Vice Chancellor when I was feeling that the dreams that I have dreamt are becoming reality, suddenly the COVID-19 issue came up and disturbed the routine life of one and all. This is the biggest ever crisis the world is facing and the University is no exception to this. Managing the crisis was not easy as sending the girls to their respective places safely, temporarily closing the University for few days, handling the financial issues during the last phase of March, protecting the safety of staff and students, and continuing the routine administration and online classes. Series of online meetings were conducted to bring back the university to normalcy maintaining social distancing. It was indeed an impossible and difficult task. On the instructions of the Government, teachers were asked to conduct online classes and monitor students' mass psyche. I really thank each and every single teacher, student, non-teaching staff who responded to the situation quite positively. Though the university is open now, teachers are conducting classes online, university administration is rolling back to its path, and still uncertainty prevails. I am happy that with everyone's spirited support I could be able to lift the morale of students and help the university discharge its constitutional functions. The University has supported the cause of needy people by distributing food kits in the villages of 5 Grama Panchayats adopted. The quarantined people in the hostel were provided with supplementary food.

Hurdles faced:

- The jurisdiction of the University was extended to the whole of Karnataka state just before my arrival here and the notification of jurisdiction extension was also issued. But the biggest question was how to bring all the colleges which were affiliated to other universities in the state under the umbrella of our university. Sincere efforts were made to convince the Government colleges' Principals, parents and the students to join the



university. Discussions were also held with Minister for Higher Education, GOK, Commissioner of Collegiate Education, GOK, Joint Directors of respective zones, Registrars' and Vice Chancellors of all state universities for implementation of Government order in this regard. Initially Colleges shown their interest to join the University but not much success was achieved.

- There was no permanent non-teaching staff on the campus as statute regarding C & R rules was not approved since beginning. Though I am successful in getting the statutes approved I could not be able to recruit the non-teaching staff except under Section 371. The main reason being, the temporary staff working here had approached the court for absorption of their service and the case is still pending. This is one area where I could not do much.
- Due to COVID-19 few buildings – Dr. B R Ambedkar Convention Center, Women's Museum which were supposed to be ready for inauguration are still incomplete. My dream of organizing 11th annual convocation in the Dr. B R Ambedkar Convention Center and seeing the Women's Museum functioning from the new building could not become reality.
